

Subject: Ferndale Terrace Project Newsletter - February 28, 2025/Vol. 3

Good morning.

As mentioned in our earlier email, Cascade Natural Gas (CNG) has begun work to relocate its gas main on



Ferndale Terrace. Relocation work on road improvement projects is very common as existing utility providers' infrastructure often occupies an area where City improvements must be placed to allow them to meet current standards or operate properly. As part of those utilities' agreements to operate within the City's public spaces, the utility companies are required to move their facilities to a location that doesn't conflict with the City's planned improvements. Therefore, CNG will not only be

relocating its gas main and services to accommodate the City's planned project upgrades, it will also be replacing its aged infrastructure within the project limits. Similar to the City's utilities in the area, CNG's piping was installed many years ago.

Starting Monday, March 3, Ferndale Terrace between Hendrickson and Legoe will be closed to through traffic to facilitate the safe and timely completion of CNG's relocation work. All through traffic (meaning those vehicles which aren't originating to/from a residence within the closure area) will be re-routed along a detour route which will be in place weekdays between 7:30am and 4:00pm and is anticipated to last up to 6 weeks. The road will be reopened to all traffic during non-working hours, including evenings and weekends. A map of the impacted area, as well as the detour route, is shown below. Once CNG has completed work on the west end of Ferndale Terrace, operations will move east, and a similar closure and detour will be enacted on Ferndale Terrace between Legoe and Vista. An updated schedule and accompanying information will be sent out once it becomes available.

If you reside within the closure area, please take extra time and use caution as work occurs in your area. Please be aware of your surroundings and follow flaggers' and workers' directions for both your and

their safety as they complete these improvements. We appreciate your patience as we take the necessary steps to improve this roadway.
